on Monday 10th June 2024











St Mary the Virgin, Ewelme is an exceptional Church with a distinguished history. The Church, Alms-houses and School were built about 1432 by William de la Pole, Duke of Suffolk, and his wife, Alyce Chaucer, granddaughter of the poet Geoffrey Chaucer. We had a guided tour by Susan Doran, Professor of History at Oxford University.

Since becoming the IT Operations Manager for Heathrow Airport, Hedley Thorne has retreated to the Ridgeway in his spare time as an antidote to the relative chaos of his job. He has combined his love of flying with the use of drones to produce aerial photography of historic landscapes.

In his talk Hedley explained the techniques that he employs to photograph key sites along the Ridgeway, how drone photography is used in collaboration with landscape art and archaeology and how perception of historical monuments is enhanced by views from above. He gave us details about one site that he photographs most frequently, Lowbury Hill, explaining some of its possible historic connections.

He finished with an atmospheric video with a 'fly-past' over many familiar sites on the Ridgeway and further afield in Wessex. Over sixty people attended his talk and it was very well received.
